Fee Remission

For the year 2010/2011, 230 students were granted remission of tuition fees (145 were granted \$52,000; 38 were granted \$40,000; 24 were granted \$28,000; 20 were granted \$16,000 and 3 were granted \$4,000). Eighty-three were recipients of book grants and 207 of Local Education Allowance. Sixty-three students were granted school bursaries.

Spiritual and Moral Education

As a Christian college, we place a strong emphasis on nurturing the spiritual growth of our students. Through daily morning assemblies, Religious Studies lessons and Christian Fellowship programmes, the practice of Christian education is enhanced. This year, the Rev Christine Ho and the Rev Canon Ian Lam officiated at our Advent and Lenten Services respectively. At these services a sum of \$60,000 was collected and donated to 20 local voluntary organisations, with \$40,000 going especially to the Hong Kong Sheng Kung Hui Archbishop Relief Fund to help the earthquake and tsunami victims in Japan.

To celebrate our 95th Anniversary, a Thanksgiving Service was held on 22 December in our school hall. The Very Rev Andrew Chan officiated at the ceremony and the Most Rev Dr Peter Kwong Archbishop Emeritus delivered the sermon. Our Ascension Day Service was held at St John's Cathedral with Rev Joseph Kok delivering the sermon. Apart from these services, a series of evangelistic activities was organised in the Religious Week from 27 October to 3 November 2010. The events included a sharing by Mr Cheung Yun Heng, a survivor of the Pak Sin Leng wildfire, a sermon by Rev Fan Chun Ho, a faith sharing luncheon, a religious book exhibition, and "Amazing Race" which was a school orienteering event.

To revisit the school motto of "Faith, Hope and Love", the theme of the Christian Fellowship this year was "We loved because God first loved us". In addition to the regular gatherings, morning prayer meetings, cell groups, and the Tuesday luncheon Bible study meetings were held to provide our students with a supportive environment for spiritual growth.

To develop our students into confident individuals, lifelong learners and responsible global citizens, a wide range of activities was organised by the Moral Education and Pastoral Care Team last year. Talks and workshops on topics like anti-corruption, sex education, anti-drugs, mental health, stress management and financial management were organised for different forms during form teacher periods and enrichment programme days. They were given by a number of organisations including the ICAC, Department of Health, St James' Settlement, Life Education Activity Programme, the Family Planning Association, Hong Kong Eating Disorders Association, Mother's Choice and Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants. Form teachers also designed and adapted various developmental activities based on the Personal, Moral and Social Framework.

Our school social workers help organise different developmental groups for specific students. The Big Brother Big Sister Scheme continued to help the

Form 1 students adapt to school life at SPCC. Two Play Sharing Practice (PSP) groups, formed by 28 Form 1 and 14 Form 2 students respectively, were set up to enhance the confidence and positive communication skills of the participants. Activities included lunchtime gatherings and sharing, social service, overnight camps and outdoor activities. Special interpersonal relationship workshops were also conducted for some classes to guide students on the management of intimate relationships.

This was the third year that we collaborated with the Baptist Oi Kwan Social Service to organise a Growth Group for Actualising Potential. Twenty-seven students from Form 1 to Form 3 participated in activities centred on communication skills and service to the elderly, rehabilitation clients and ethnic minorities.

Extra-Curricular Activities and Enrichment Programmes

Self-organised extra-curricular activities have always been an important component of students' education. These activities not only allow students to join programmes of their own choice, but also enable them to learn about leadership and teamwork, as well as undergo gratifying and rewarding experiences. A list of extra-curricular activities offered is given in **Table 1**.

Enrichment programmes for all forms were organised three times in the year to further enrich students' knowledge and experience in different areas. Activities included talks by professionals and renowned personnel related to moral and civic education, culture, science, environmental protection and health education. Outings and field trips were also organised by teachers. In particular, we had our first student-initiated activity arranged by Form 4 students.

The important highlight of our student programmes, Student Activities Week, was organised from 20 to 28 November 2010. Lessons were suspended for Form 1 to Form 6 so that the students could take part in different activities: Form 1 Life Education Programme, Form 2 Cultural Trip to Beijing, Form 3 Study Trip to Nansha, Form 4 Outward Bound Leadership Programme and Community Service Projects, Form 5 and 6 attachment programmes to tertiary institutions and business organisations as well as their self-initiated programmes, which aimed to develop students' understanding of professional fields.

Other programmes were organised to suit the students' individual needs: leadership programmes such as the Cheongshim Model United Nations (South Korea) in February 2011, the new Prefects' Leadership Training Programme

(Guangzhou) in August 2011 in collaboration with Amway China, and study tours to various places, including mainland China, Singapore, Australia, South Africa, Canada, the US and the UK.

Our Swimming Gala was held on 24 September 2010 at Victoria Park Swimming Pool with Mrs Flora Wong, Chairperson of the SPCC Parent Teacher Association, being the guest of honour for the prize presentation. Our annual Sports Day was held on 5 and 6 October 2010 at Siu Sai Wan Sports Ground with a representative from the High School Attached to Tsinghua University being the guest of honour presenting the prizes.

Form 1 students were introduced to track and field events on the Athletics Activities Day on 14 January 2011 while Form 2 and Form 3 students had the opportunity to try out various sports on 18 April 2011 and 11 March 2011 respectively. These sports included tenpin bowling, lawn bowls, archery, orienteering, hockey, golf and sports climbing.

To allow students to make better use of their summer vacation, a Summer Sports Training Programme was arranged for all students. This year's activities included basketball, fencing, squash, swimming, yoga, dance (hip hop), badminton, and table tennis. Intensive training was provided for members of the school teams, including basketball, badminton, volleyball, fencing, soccer, swimming and table tennis.

This was another eventful year for our music makers. In the 63rd Hong Kong Schools Music Festival in 2011, the Treble Choir, Senior Mixed Choir, Madrigal Group, Orchestra, Harmonica Orchestra and Ensembles earned 3 firsts, 3 seconds and 1 third in the group events.

Talented young musicians received top honours in local and international competitions: Ng Sin Nam Claudia (2F) won the First Prize of the Parsons Music Scholarship for Wind, Brass and Percussion Instruments in the 63rd Hong Kong Schools Music Festival. Ng Sin Nam Claudia (2F) and Chow Man Kin Teddy (4G) were the youngest chosen by RTHK Radio 4 to record for its "Young Music Makers" series. Admitted with a scholarship to the Berkeley College of Music, Cheung Pui Chih Joyce (6B) – the first recipient of the Young Talents (Music) Scholarship – undertook an orchestration project as part of her personalised learning programme. The year-long project culminated in the première of her symphonic poem, "Heaven on Earth" by the School Orchestra in May 2011.

Our Choral CD album, "Faith Hope Love", released on the Naxos label in December 2010, was one of the best sellers in local record stores and received favourable reviews from the press.

Student Union

The Student Union (SU), in its tenth year in office, has continued to thrive and excel. While launching in-school and joint-school activities remained its fundamental role, the SU also made a sincere effort to create a stronger unity in school and to forge better communication between the school and the student body.

The SU offered dynamic activities, including Book Café, Stationery Megasale, Christmas Fever and Vibraphonic Singing Contest. Three Student Posts were issued: two of them gave a comprehensive review of school events and interviews with prestigious alumni, and the other was a special edition to celebrate the tenth anniversary of the SU. On top of that, the SU expanded its Opinion Programme through placing interactive display boards around the campus and engaging students in thoughtful and pertinent discussions through focus group meetings.

The SU contributed extensively to the youth community by holding a joint-school leadership training programme, "The Apprentice". Bearing the theme of "Passing on", the SU aspired to equip talented and intelligent youngsters with the essential skills and knowledge of leadership, and to instill in them a sense of responsibility and commitment. The SU was also actively involved in the preparation for the school's 95th anniversary bazaar.

4. Achievements in Extra-curricular Activities

Campus Improvement

Secondary School Redevelopment Phase 1 is now almost finished, with only the dormitory to be completed. The teaching portion has been in operation since 1 September 2011 as scheduled. There are new facilities: an Indoor Games Hall, a Cafeteria, a Lecture Theatre, 21 classrooms, 2 special rooms and 8 laboratories. Fitting out works for the dormitory portion is in progress and it shall be ready for use by the end of 2011. This signifies a major milestone in the Secondary School Campus Improvement.

Regarding Secondary School Redevelopment Phase 2 – alteration and addition works to the existing campus and Heritage Impact Assessment for works to be carried out in the Grade II Historical Red Brick Building were approved in February 2011. Government funding for the project was subsequently approved in May 2011. The Main Contract was awarded in August 2011 and site works commenced during the summer holiday. Part

of the existing campus has been fenced off for construction works. In order to enhance safety and security, the Phase 2 contractor has a separate entrance from Tramway Path and separate circulation within the site areas. Construction works will continue till 2013.

Involvement of Parents and Alumni

This year saw parents' continuous and enthusiastic support for the School, furthering our collaboration in providing a quality, holistic education to our students. Please refer to **Table 2** for details of the activities of the Parent-Teacher Association.

Donations to Charitable Causes and Fund-raising Campaign

Being a Christian school, we have always attached great importance to caring and sharing. On the Dress Special Day on 28 September 2010, we raised a total of \$55,746 for the Community Chest. Twice in the year, we collected donations from our students and staff to be distributed to the following charitable organisations:

Oxfam, Hong Kong Sheng Kung Hui Welfare Council, Hong Kong Sheng Kung Hui Archbishop World Relief Fund, St John's Cathedral, the Spastic Association of Hong Kong, the Hong Kong Anti-Cancer Society, the Boys' and Girls' Club Association, the Hong Kong Tuberculosis, Chest and Heart Diseases Association, St James' Settlement, the Hong Kong Red Cross, St John Ambulance Association and Brigade, the Society for the Relief of Disabled Children, the Children's Cancer Foundation, Unicef, Cedar Fund, Samaritan's Purse, World Vision, Fellowship of Evangelical Students (HK) Limited, Medecins Sans Frontieres, Against Child Abuse Limited and Heifer International Hong Kong Limited.

The Council of St. Paul's Co-educational College Charitable Trust organised its annual Walkathon at The Peak on 7 November 2010. With the enthusiastic support of parents, staff, alumni and students, a total of HK\$2,845,537 was raised.

Major Tasks Accomplished

1. Holistic, developmental and experiential learning in the four dimensions of Leadership and Community Service; Language and Culture; Humanities, Science and Mathematics; Aesthetics and Creativity

Leadership and Community Service

During the Student Activities Week (SAW), Form 1 students enjoyed a safe and engaging outdoor learning programme with Asia Pacific Adventure. Form 2 students travelled to Beijing for a language skills development programme in association with the University of Hong Kong. This programme had been significantly re-designed to provide better opportunities for students to practise and develop their Putonghua language skills by completing urban-based problem-solving tasks and by interviewing local people. In Form 3, we completed a successful Nansha study trip in collaboration with the Hong Kong University of Science and Technology and this programme has developed a strong curriculum link with Liberal Studies. In Form 4, we continued our long-standing relationship with Outward Bound with Form 4 students completing a five-day mobile expedition programme. Other Form 4 students who had participated in the Rites of Passage programme were engaged in two five-day community service projects with Crossroads International and the Agricultural Fisheries and Conservation Department. As the NSS curriculum has been implemented we have allowed Form 5 students to participate in the SAW, which was not the case in the past due to examination pressure. Two options were offered to Form 5 and Form 6 students with 90 of them organising their own Self-Initiated Learning programmes and the remaining 200 participating in a variety of business and university attachment programmes across a diverse range of sectors.

Our Form 1 to Form 3 community service attachments were conducted with the Kadoorie Farm and Botanic Garden, TWGHs Women's Welfare Club Western District, Hong Kong Residential Care Home for the Elderly and the Saviour Lutheran School for students with learning disabilities.

Rites of Passage

This was the third Rites of Passage programme with 119 students challenging themselves for 28 days in Queensland, Australia through a variety of experiences focusing around the following four key components: community living, outdoor experiential activities, expeditions and enquiry learning. The programme is well aligned with the school's Personal, Moral and Social Framework and significantly challenged the students both physically and emotionally. In preparation for the delivery of the first full cohort in 2012, the programme was split across two campuses. All the logistical arrangements ran smoothly and students' evaluations reported a consistent learning experience across the two residential campuses.

Round Square

In October 2010, SPCC attended the International Round Square Conference at Regents School in Thailand, where we were formally welcomed as a regional member of Round Square. The exchange network has allowed us to tap into the potential for exchanges with Anania Shirakatsy Lyceum, a school in Armenia.

Language and Culture

Foreign Language Studies

In 2010/2011, we offered two streams of foreign language programmes to students: Programme A for interest, and Programme B for academic pursuit.

For Programme A, we had two Year 1 Spanish/Arabic classes and one Year 2 Spanish class on weekdays after school. They focused on exposing students to the Spanish and Arabic cultures through the basics of these languages.

For Programme B, we offered both Foundation Spanish and Foundation French Levels 1 & 2 classes on weekdays and Saturdays. The purpose of these classes was to build up students' foundation in the two languages, thus paving the way for foreign language studies in senior secondary.

We also had one IGCSE Spanish 1 (F3), one IGCSE Spanish 2/NSS AS Spanish 1 (F4) and one NSS AS Spanish 2 (F5) class also on weekdays and Saturdays. Students in NSS AS Spanish 1 (F4) took their IGCSE Spanish examination in May 2011. Four of the nine candidates achieved the highest banding A*, four scored A and one got a B.

Culture Salon

The theme for 2010/2011 was Cultural Perspectives of Secondary Students (中學生的文化眼界). This was organised on two levels: guest speakers were invited to share their view on the above-mentioned theme with the whole school during morning assemblies; mini-salons and Enthusiasts Circles (同好小組) were held for like-minded students who shared similar cultural interests.

Aesthetics and Creativity

The Odyssey of the Mind Competition was held in April 2011 at the Hong Kong Institute of Education. A team of seven Form 4 students participated in Division III, Classical Problem – "Le Tour Guide". They won First Prize for the Spontaneous Problem and were ranked sixth overall.

Two students from Form 3 and Form 5 participated in the competition, 'Home Fish Home', which was organised by the Hong Kong Design Centre and Hong Kong Ocean Park. They won the award for The Highest Voted Design and the 1st runner-up for The Most Creative Design. Their artwork was exhibited at Hong Kong Ocean Park in December. The Committee on Youth Smoking Prevention held a Sticker Design Competition, 'No Gambling', in April. A Form 3 student won First Prize for The Most Popular Award and merit for The Best Design out of 73 participating schools.

Through the scheme of 'Artwork on Loan', the College invited a famous comics artist in Hong Kong, Mr Liu Sze Keung Sky, to share with us his experience in creativity and to run a workshop for Form 2 students in March. Five pieces of his reproduced artwork were borrowed and put on display around our campus. We also invited the Assistant Curator I of the Hong Kong Museum of History, Mr Cheung Yui Sum, to give us a talk on 'Transformation of the Qipao'.

Five students from Form 4 to Form 7 joined 'Discover Design 2011' which was implemented by the Hong Kong Design Centre and Hong Kong Disneyland. The students attended activities including Creative Tour, Design Workshop and Meet-the-Designer in July. Their artwork was displayed at Roving Exhibition in September. We also nominated one Form 5 student to join the 3rd Arts Ambassadors-in-School Scheme and organised a visit to the exhibition 'Pixar: 25 Years of Animation', which was hosted by the Hong Kong Heritage Museum.

2. Planning and preparation for Diploma of Secondary Education (DSE) and International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme (IBDP)

For the cohort of students promoted to Form 4 in 2011/2012, we are able to offer them a total of 43 subject combinations for the Senior Secondary Curriculum, each consisting of three electives. In addition, students may take Music, Spanish or French as a fourth elective. A briefing was held in December 2010 for Form 3 students and parents; they also received a Senior Secondary Curriculum Subject Information booklet. Relevant information was uploaded to the school's intranet. In the allocation of subject choices, 86% of the students were allocated their first preference. Six students took Music and 15 students took Spanish as a fourth elective. All students meeting the required standard are allowed to take a mathematics module in Form 5 and 6.

The IB pre-authorisation visit was conducted on 22 September 2010, followed by the two-day authorisation visit on 21 and 22 February 2011. During the two days of the authorisation visit, the IBO team made very positive comments about our school, our students and our teachers. The first IB cohort students who were in their Preparatory Year impressed the IBO team not only with their understanding of the programme and their articulation of it but also, more importantly, as confident and reflective learners. The team was also very happy with our teachers whom they found to have displayed great professionalism. We were formally informed on 21 March 2011 that we had been granted the status of an IB World School.

Throughout the school year, the teachers have continued to prepare themselves and the students for the implementation of the diploma programme. A comprehensive Handbook of Studies for the IBDP (2011/2012) has been developed and given to the Prep Year students. A briefing session for students and parents was conducted to explain the school's Assessment and Reporting Policy, Language Policy, Academic Honesty Policy, Assessment/Deadline Calendar and Timetable, and matters related to the choice of higher level and standard level were explained.

3. Student Development

Catering for differentiated needs and capabilities of students

The centralised database of high and low achievers, gifted students and students with learning difficulties was restructured and sorted in different ways for easy reference. Greater attention was given to students in remedial classes with a smaller class size of no more than 10 in classes. Curriculums for remedial classes were tailor-made for individual needs. Enrichment programmes were organised for all students, eg Student Activities Week, Junior Science Curriculum, Public Speaking Workshop. There were also Science competitions and projects and after-school training on Mathematics, Physics, Biology and Chemistry, for selected students. Ten Form 1 and four Form 2 students who have been identified as exceptionally gifted in music were pulled out from normal music lessons to attend tailor-made programmes for the musically gifted. In addition, four exceptionally gifted students in Mathematics, two in Humanities, three in Science and five in Leadership were nominated to join enrichment programmes organised by the Hong Kong Academy for Gifted Education; nine students were nominated to join the Enrichment programmes organised by Fung Hon Chu Gifted Education Centre.

Making students partners in learning

The target-setting forms in the Student Profile have continued to be effective and useful for form teachers when discussing academic performance with their students. During Form-teacher periods, Religious Studies and Liberal Studies lessons, students were able to take up at least one social or moral issue and lead the class in discussion. Ninety-one Form 5 and Form 6 students chose to plan their own Self-Initiated Programme during the Student Activities Week which was better than expected.

Development and implementation of the Personal, Moral and Social (PMS) Framework

A new, more concise version of the PMS Framework has been generated. It is easier to use and can better embrace the IB Learning Profile as keywords are provided for better understanding. The Framework has been introduced to our Primary School, and more discussion and collaboration with teachers and parents is to follow. A task force on the use of information technology to record and track student development and also to collect feedback from students - the iPortfolio system - will be set up in the next school year in the College.

4. Enhancement of teacher professional development and personal wellness

The use of the teaching pedagogies of Mastery Teaching and Cooperative Learning on different levels continues to be explored, tried and peer-observed. New teachers were mentored and resources were shared within the

departments. A staff development activity on the sharing of good practices in these two pedagogies by the Chinese, History, Physics, Liberal Studies and Art Departments was held. The Appraisal System has been revised to include the requirement to be able to use these two pedagogies effectively, and the revised system was smoothly implemented.

Other staff development activities included talks on: Handling Students with Proactive Aggression and Reactive Aggression by Dr Annis Fung, director of Project CARE; and Education in a Changing Environment by Dr York Liao, Chairman of The Hong Kong Council for Accreditation of Academic and Vocational Qualifications.

A continued effort was made to enhance teachers' physical and mental wellness with the Staff Professional and Personal Wellness Committee and the Staffroom Representatives working together to identify issues and concerns in each Staffroom. The Project and Administrative Offices have provided support whenever necessary.

In order to strengthen the feedback loop in the teacher appraisal system, starting from this year, the Principal will meet individual teachers who have undergone formal appraisal to discuss their performance in non-teaching duties.

5. Stakeholders' Survey (SHS) and Assessment Programme for Affective and Social Outcome (APASO)

The SHS and APASO were conducted from January to March 2011 to collect the views of teachers, students and parents regarding major aspects of school and students' attitudes to school respectively. The SHS consists of items related to management and organisation, learning and teaching, student support and school ethos. The resulting data is important for the school's evaluation and development of the school plan.

We are happy to note that in 2008/2009, 2009/2010, and 2010/2011, our school performed better than the average of other schools in all 25 indicators in the Key Performance Measure, which is generated from the data of the SHS and APASO (Report provided by the Education Bureau). Furthermore, this year, in comparison to the SHS and APASO that we conducted in 2005/2006, we have either performed equally well or have shown improvement in all except one indicator.

Nevertheless, we have identified three issues from the survey and we plan to take improvement measures in the coming years. The issues are: enhancing the school's transparency in decision making, having teacher development activities that are more suited to the needs of teachers, and providing greater support to students' mental and emotional needs.
