The Council of St. Paul's Co-educational College Charitable Trust was established in January 1999. Its objective is to accept donations and provide financial support to St. Paul's Co-educational College and its Primary School. The Trust is set up as a charitable institution which is exempted from tax under Section 88 of the Inland Revenue Ordinance.



Landmark Fundraising Campaign 2002-2007

The Trust achieved a significant milestone with the conclusion of the five-year Landmark Fundraising Campaign in 2007. This campaign was a remarkable success, raising HK\$320 million. The funds raised were allocated to two major projects: the construction of the Primary School campus in Wong Chuk Hang and the redevelopment of the Secondary School campus on MacDonnell Road.



In 2013, SPCC initiated the Centenary Fundraising Campaign to commemorate its 100th anniversary. The campaign concluded in August 2016, raising HK\$212.8 million. Its aim was to establish endowment funds in the four major areas: Music, Sports, Arts and Culture, Leadership and Experiential Learning. These funds would generate recurrent income to support SPCC's educational goals: to offer our **best students the best education** with the **best teaching force**.

SPCC Charitable Trust has been a steadfast supporter for SPCC since its inception, providing annual grants to facilitate a wide array of enrichment and training programmes, as well as educational initiatives. Supporters who commit to donating for one year will have their names acknowledged under the three categories in the SPCC Fundraising Annual Report.
