The training camp is well-run and effective in general [4.05] There is a good balance between team-bonding and rehearsing during the camp. [3.84] After the training camp, students in the group bonded better and as a result, worked better as a team. [3.89] I look forward to the training camp. [4.21] The choir garnered two First Places, a First Runner-up and a Second-Runner-up in the 71st Hong Kong Schools Music Festival in March, and was also crowned the Best Boys' Choir of the Year in the Choir Final.
